### *Sample Listing of KU*now!* Courses Offered*

**ACCT 2200 Principles of Accounting I:** This course is an introduction to accounting concepts and principles used in the preparation of financial reports, the techniques of debit and credit, trial balances adjustments and statements.

**ASTR 1100 Introduction to Astronomy:** A study our solar system and the sidereal universe, with an emphasis on the nature of astronomical investigation. ( 3 hr lec./3 hr. lab)

**BIO 1000 Principles of Biology:** An introduction to the structure and function of living cells and organisms and their interdependencies and adaptations to the environment (3 hr lec./3 hr. lab)

**CDD 1101 American Sign Language I** Introductory course to American Sign Language includes exposure to and practice with ASL terms, concepts, finger spelling, and interactions with the Deaf community.

**COMM 1402 Speech Communication as Critical Citizenship:** Understanding and practicing speech communication as a central value of a civil society. It is this value that provides the frame for producing, presenting, interpreting and evaluating oral messages in small group and public speaking contexts.

**CPS 1031 Introduction to Computers:** This course is a study of the concepts and components: historical development of computers; data representations and files; operating system software.

**ECO 1020 Principles of Economics I:** The American economy; aggregate economics with emphasis on relationships of income, consumption, savings, investment, money & banking economic growth and the role of government.

**ENG 1030 College Composition:** Expository and persuasive writing for academic purposes. Emphasis upon writing as a reflective, social process: writing across the curriculum; critical thinking and the development of a personal intellectual perspective and style of expression.

**ENG 2000 Writing about Literature:** Critical reading and writing about fiction, poetry and drama. measurement, observing technology and systems.

**FA 1000 Introduction to Art:** This course is about exploration of the theories and techniques of art and the creative process through direct experience with material and ideas.

**MATH 2411 Calculus I:** Functions, limits and continuity, differentiation of algebraic and trigonometric functions, tangent and normal lines. Newton's method, optimization and related rate problems. Applications to the physical, biological and managerial sciences. Computer Applications. Prerequisite: MATH 1054 or the equivalent

**PSY 1000 General Psychology:** Introduction to the scientific study of behavior, biological bases of development and behavior, learning, motivation, perception, cognition, personality, abnormal behavior, measurement of behavior and social behavior.

**SOC 1000 Introduction to Sociology:** This course is about the study of social life, society, and the individual within a global and multicultural context.
