The Hanover Park Regional High School District is comprised of two high schools with a combined enrollment of 1,465 students. Hanover Park High School is located in East Hanover and receives students from East Hanover and Florham Park. Whippany Park High School is located in Hanover Township and receives students from Hanover Township. The district enjoys a tradition of excellence with an ongoing commitment to academics, the arts, athletics, extra/co-curricular activities, character education, service learning and community service.

### New Initiatives

- Increased graduation requirement from 130 credits to 140 credits with the Class of 2014.
- Added new semester courses: Introduction to Business; Genocide Studies; Music Technology; American Popular Music; Fundamentals of Wellness (college credit from UMDNJ).
- Added Advanced Placement Courses: English Language and Composition; World History (also available to freshmen); and, United States Government and Politics. Total AP offerings will be eleven courses.
- Transitioned to a new student data-based system Power School which supports an open teacher's grade book to students and parents.
- Introduced the new semester course—Freshmen Seminar—with the Naviance Career Planning and Learning Styles components.
- Administered 305 Advanced Placement tests with a district average of 84% of students scoring a 3 or higher for the 2010-2011 school year.
- Enrolled over 200 students district-wide in dual credit courses— Middle College of Fairleigh Dickinson; Project Acceleration of Seton Hall; Health Career Courses of University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey.
- Enriched the district's Character Education program with curriculum imbedded service learning projects.
