Book	Last name, First name. <i>Title of the book</i> . Place of publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium of Publication. <i>Example:</i> Giblin, James Cross. <i>Good Brother, Bad Brother: The Story of Edwin Booth and John Wilkes Booth</i> . New York: Clarion Books, 2005. Print.
Book with two authors	Last name of first author, First name "and" First name and Last name of second author, <i>Title of the book</i> . Place of publication: publisher, date. Medium of Publication. <i>Example:</i> Eggsins, Suzanne, and Dina Slade. <i>Analyzing Casual Conservation</i> . London: Cassell, 1997. Print.
Reference book	"Title of article." <i>Name of reference</i> . Edition. Year. Medium of Publication. <i>Example:</i> "Lyme Disease." <i>The Gale Encyclopedia of Medicine</i> . 2nd ed. 2002. Print.
Article in a periodical Such as a magazine or newspaper	Last name, First name. "Title of article." <i>Title of periodical</i> date of publication page #. (if there is more than one edition of a newspaper indicate the edition following the date) Medium of publication. <i>Example:</i> Mehta, Pratap Bhanu. "Exploding Myths." <i>New Republic</i> 6 June 1998: 17-19. Print.
Interview	Last name of the person interviewed, First name. Kind of interview. Date of interview. <i>Example:</i> Smith, Mary. Personal interview. 15 Oct. 2010.
Web site	Author(s), editor(s), or compiler name (if available) Last name, First name. <i>Name of the site</i> . Version number. Name of institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher), Date of posting/revision/update (if available). Medium of publication. Date of access. <i>Example:</i> Felluga, Dino. <i>Guide to Literary and Critical Theory</i> . Purdue U, 28 Nov. 2003. Web. 10 May 2010.
Image (online)* Note: If you are citing an image found in Google Images or any other image retrieval service, be certain to cite the image in its original context.	Image creator's Last name, First name. <i>Work of art</i> . Date of creation. Institution where the work is housed. <i>Website title</i> . Medium of publication. Date image was viewed. <i>Example:</i> Goya, Francisco. <i>The Family of Charles IV</i> . 1800. Museo Nacional del Prado, Madrid. <i>Museo Nacional del Prado</i> . Web. 22 May 2010.

Remember to use *n.p.* if no publisher name is available and *n.d.* if no publishing date is given.

MLA Citation for Article Databases & eBooks

For an article from the WPHS library's subscription database service or from the Thompson Gale eBooks, each citation should be formatted as follows:

Database Article	First Author Last Name, First Author First Name, and Second Author First Name Second Author Last Name. "Title of the article." <i>Journal title</i> Volume Num. Issue Num (Publication Year): Start Page-End Page. <i>Database Name</i> . Medium of publication. Day Month Year of access. <i>Example:</i> Barrera, Rebeca María. "A Case for Bilingual Education." <i>Scholastic Parent and Child</i> Nov.-Dec. 2004: 72-73. <i>Academic Search Premier</i> . Web. 1 Feb. 2010.
eBooks (from Thompson Gale)	"Title of section or part of book." <i>Title of Book</i> . Ed. Editor #1 First Name Last Name and Editor #2 First Name Last Name. Vol. #. Place of publication: Publisher, Year. Page(s). <i>Gale Virtual Reference Library</i> . Gale. Medium of publication. Day Month Year of Access. <i>Example:</i> "The Necklace." <i>Short Stories for Students</i> . Ed. Kathleen Wilson and Marie Lazzari. Vol. 4. Detroit: Gale, 1998. 166-181. <i>Gale Virtual Reference Library</i> . Gale. Web. 23 Apr. 2009.

Note:

- If there is no author listed, begin the citation with the article title and alphabetize it in the works cited list by the title. If an article title begins with A, An, or The, ignore it when you are alphabetizing your works cited list.
- Abbreviate the name of all months **except** May, June, and July when listing the date of publication and date of access.
- When citing articles from newspapers or magazines, do not insert a comma or period between the title of the publication and the publication date.
